DIRECTOR'S NOTES



n Annie Baker's author's note, she urges theater makers to "heed the pauses and silences in this play." She then goes on to describe how many seconds to hold for a pause, a short pause, a long

pause, a silence, and a long silence (a long silence is 7 seconds, by the way).

This obsessive detail delights me because it signals to us that Baker is boldly challenging what she calls one of the last remaining taboos of theater—silence. While theater makers are so often trying to take the pauses *out* of plays, pick up the pace, and drive through each scene, Baker willfully inserts silences and moments of ripe stillness. By opening this fraught and complicated space between people, her delicate and fiercely funny play reveals how desperately we need one another. In these silences, we witness the heart breaking and hilarious ways we try to connect despite our many, many flaws and failings. And how we keep trying even after humiliation and heartbreak. We keep trying. Extraordinary.

This play is for anyone who has ever done something brave in order to feel less alone. This play is for anyone who has put themselves out there and braved rejection in an attempt to make meaning and connection. This play is for you. You are doing a good job. Thank you for showing up. Please keep trying. –*Renee Prince, director*
